






He'll open up a healing service somewhere, or you'd be guided to somebody who prays for the sick when you got sickness.


If not, He'll just put it upon your heart so bad, you'll just kneel down in the room and ask Him about it yourself. That's right.

He said, "I did it."


Said, "Well, you must be a cruel shepherd."


Said, "No, I did it so I could show it special care, so it would follow me."

10 And then I thought I'd call the prayer line, and get the people up, to pray for them. But, instead of doing that, the Holy Spirit begin to move out into the


meeting, over the people, just to calling them. And It passed over the old fellow, about twice. And then, all of a sudden, I said, "We'll just pray."




The Christian has not one worry in the world.
