


## If You Want Power, See How Humble You Can Get

Just get away from all your worldly thinking, and humble yourself before God, and then you've got more power than the man that runs all over the building and makes a big lot of noise; see,

### because you have been able to conquer yourself, and commit yourself to Christ, you see, to humble yourself before Him. That's really power.



78 You show me a church that's humble, real humble, not a—a arrogancy; a church, just a sweet, humble church, I'll show you a church that has the favor and power of God in it. That's right. That's the thing it takes, humility, humbling ourselves before God, letting God just work through us. Don't have to make a lot of noise.

79 Sometimes, as the farmer said, he went out to the field with his wagon, and,

every time he hit a bump, it just rattled and went on. But when he come back, he hit the same bump and didn't make no noise at all, because it was loaded with good things.



80 So I think that's just about right, see, that we get filled up with the good things of God, that the fruit of the Spirit might be known through us. As he referred so much to First Corinthians 13 there, and how, that, "Though I give my body to be burnt, and have all these things, and have not charity; it's nothing, profiteth me nothing." See, we want to do that.

81 Above all things, it's our individual souls that we're responsible before God. See, it—it's *you* going to Heaven. It isn't whether *I* go, or *he* goes.

It's *you* going, see, and you first. And you've got to look this out and come sweet before the Lord.

Neither did you, in youryour sin, and adultery, and everything that you lived in. You didn't express nothing. But there was a seed in there, and it got a chance to press itself into Light. Greatness!



251 A Seed cannot. A Seed of God cannot bring forth a bob-haired woman. It cannot do it. Just can't do it, 'cause the Bible said so. See, It can't do it. No, sir. Now it seems so hard to humble to God's Word.

252 Notice it in Genesis 4:6 and 7, just reading off some Scripture here. "Do as Abel did." He said, "If you—you see what your brother..." Said, "Go ahead and do what Abel did, do the same kind of a service that he did, and—and I will bless you. If you don't, sin layeth at the door." Now, sin is "unbelief." "If you don't do as Abel did! You seen I've vindicated him,

and made him right. Now if you don't do that, then it shows that—that sin, unbelief, lays at the door." See?

253 And today they see what God vindicates. They see what God is a-doing. They see all these things happening. They know about it. God is showing His signs in the heaven above and on earth below, and all these things like that, and they see what is taking place. But they won't do it. See, Satan,

serpent's seed; smart, come out of seminaries, educated to the spot, every word, every everything, stand in the pulpit just as correct, and every word has to be exactly, the grammar has to be right, and everything right. See? Sure, they can't humble themselves down, a guy like that. See, they just can't do it. They don't. They just can't do it.

254 Now, "If not, sin lies at the door; unbelief lays," then he become wilfully disobedient. "And when you know to do good, and do it not, to you it's sin," if you know what's right and you don't do it. See? Then he become wilfully disobedient after the Word had been vindicated, then he crossed the separating line, then he was ousted from Eden when he crossed. 255 That's the New Testament. Is that right? "If we sin wilfully after we receive the Knowledge that's been preached to you, read to you, proved to you; after we see the knowledge of the Truth, and you go ahead and unbelieve, wilfully, there is no more sacrifice for sin."

But a...fearful looking...to the fiery indignation, who shall devour the adversary.

256 Is that right? You can cross that line. Like the children of Israel did in their journey, coming through the wilderness, Israel did the same. After they heard Moses' message and seen it vindicated; listened to a false

prophet that said, "Oh, now look, children, we're all the same. We should marry one among another, and we should do this." And Moses had told them different, and seen God vindicate it. Because, Balaam seemed to be a more instructive man than Moses was, see. He had come from a great nation where there was great people, and was all organized together, the land of Moab, great armies, and great things

that the people in them days would have feared. And here come a prophet down, a prophet, anointed one, false anointed one, see, come down to an anointed one (look how close), and taught the people, and many of them went after that. Don't you never forget that. See, went after the thing that wasn't the Word, the vindicated proven Word!

257 Don't let someone come in here and tell you

something different. Watch what God is vindicating and proving.

258 Now if them people looked back, and say, "Moses! God appeared in the skies. And the man spoke into existence, fleas, flies, frogs; took out of existence, boils and diseases. Opened up the Red Sea, and we come...And fed us manna out of heaven. Oh, that's our prophet!"


259 But here come another prophet down, "Glory to God!

I'm a prophet, too." Say, "Now, you all, I'll tell you. Now, now you understand, I use better grammar than Moses. And I am *this* way and *that* way, see," and so forth.

260 And the first thing you know, they fell for it. And every one of them perished right in the wilderness. Not a one of them lived. They never did. They won't be in Heaven, not one of them. Jesus said. 261 They said, "Our fathers eat manna in the wilderness!" See, Pentecostal, is right, see, they had really come through all the experiences. 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
111 Oh, be conscious! Here is only one thing to be conscious of, your littleness. If you want to get somewhere with God, make yourself real little.

Don't make yourself big like Uzziah. He got in there, and he said, "I'll do this, anyhow. Whether I...You ain't got no business telling me." See?



But be good to those who are not good to you, do something for those that would not do nothing for you.



Others think, "Cause I speak with tongues, that's all I have to do." Some thinks, "Because I got power to heal the sick, that's all I have to do." It's not! It's the grace of God that saves you, God's amazing grace. I cannot trust in any merits. Some said, "Well,

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there's a great man. That man, I've heard him stand up and do *this*, I've heard him stand up and do *that*."



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59 Paul said, in First Corinthians 13, "Though I speak with tongue of men and Angels, though I have discernment, though I have gifts, to feed, I'll take all my to feed the goods poor, though I can move mountains with faith, though I have knowledge to understand all things, I am nothing till love comes in, which is grace." God has to do it. You can do all these things and still be lost. It's grace that

# saves you, God's grace to the human race.



60 To think of Him! I was thinking of that grace immediately after that appeared Friday morning, just

at the break of day, up there in that field when I set on a log, later, and tears come down in my eyes. "O, God, Your grace has stooped to save me. Why did You ever have such pity upon a poor, illiterate wretch like myself? How did You ever come down to our humble little tabernacle, where peace, and people of low walk of life, poor, have nothing in this world, and still Your grace is spread abroad in our hearts,

by the Holy Spirit, that You heal our sickness and save our sins, save us from our sins, rather, and make us Your people, deal with us?"



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61 Then I thought of David, how that when he took a notion to build a house unto the Lord, said, "It's not right for me to live in a house of cedar, and the Ark of the covenant of my God under sheepskins and a tabernacle."

62 God told the prophet, "Go tell My servant, David, I took him from the sheepcote, from feeding them few sheep out there of his daddy's, and 'made you a

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# great name like great men in the earth."



63 I thought of the grace of God, how that He could do that, save to the

uttermost! And then would take a poor wretch like myself, and give me the opportunity to preach the Gospel and to see others saved, see them healed; see homes that's been broke up, straightened up again; see lives that's been ruined, made right again. And to give me grace! I thought, "Oh, it's amazing grace!" Then come to a degraded, low squirrel hunter out into the woods, and form Himself in the form of the *rainbow*, which means a "covenant," with a Message that He give me to preach, and form it there in a covenant, that He's behind It! And He'll be behind It, because the Message is of Jesus Christ and His glory.



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64 How He's let me go all over the world, around the world, to the nations, to the millions of people, seen millions coming to the Lord and accept Him as personal Saviour, seen them filled with His goodness and sanctified by His power, see them healed by His great omnipotent power. Then I can cry like the prophet, and said, "It's not by power, nor by might, but it's by the Spirit of God." Not by education, not by theology, but by the Spirit of God He saves the people. By the Spirit of God He heals the people. It's the Spirit of God that gives the Message to the people. It's the Spirit of God that confirms the Word.

65 We've got theologians today, we've got Doctors of Divinity, we've got great men all over the world, that's smart, intelligent and educated. But it takes the simplicity of believing God, to make His Word speak out, to show that Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever. Takes a humble heart dedicated to God, to bring Jesus Christ unto present tense. Amen! If it taken theology, what would the Presbyterian, Methodist. Baptist, Catholic, and so forth; we wouldn't have a chance, us poor unlearned people. But it doesn't take knowledge. "Not by power or by might, but by My Spirit,"


saith God, "I'll unfold this mystery." And, "He will cry to it, Grace, grace, with shoutings and cryings." That's what it is today, God's amazing grace to His people. How He takes the illiterate, the unlearned, shows that Jesus is the same.

66 When He came, He never come to the great theologians. Neither did He go to Caiaphas, the high priest; only to be condemned by him.



67 But He took fishermen, men who were poor and walked the common life. And to there He revealed Himself, and said, "Follow Me, and I'll make you fishers of men," show that His grace still reached down even from the Jews to the Gentiles, to call a people for His Name in this last days, as we have just been through it. Amazing grace, how sweet the sound!

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
