And now, some glorious day He shall come the second time in glory to bring us from the graves, and then we will be like unto His own glorious body. We shall see Him as He is. No more prayer for the sick then, it's all finished.

4 We long with anxious hearts, thinking of the great time when we'll have the

Lord's supper together, drink the vine—the fruit of the vine and eat anew of the food in the Kingdom of God and see that great table spread out for thousands of miles, all the redeemed of all ages gathered around the table. As we look across at each other and shake each other's hands, a little teardrop run down our cheek, then the King in His beauty shall come out in His white robe, walk down along the table, and wipe all

tears from our eyes, and say, "Don't cry, children, it's all over. Enter into the joys of the Lord which is prepared for you since the foundation of the world."

Father God, we pray that every person here in Divine Presence tonight will answer the roll call there and have the privilege of hearing those words said, "It was well done, My good and faithful servant." If there be some here tonight, Lord, who doesn't know You,

their sins are not under the Blood, may this be the hour that their final decision will be made and their names recorded in glory.

negligent, you just didn't use it, or you let something else stand in your way? You let little petty things that meant nothing to you, after all, little fusses, and stews, and arguments, and church differences, take the meekness and gentleness from your life. Would you want to stand before the Father like that? I don't believe you would. I don't believe that you would do it. Neither would I.

88 How I want Him to say, "It was well done." Not by the skin of my teeth; but, "It was well done, My good and faithful servant. Enter into the joys of the Lord, for you did well with what you have to do."

89 Maybe you're a housewife. If you are, God made you a teacher of your children. Do a good job out of it. Regardless of what you have to do, do it well.

90 Notice, then, if the child did prove to be a real worthy of the things that the father had over his kingdom, and had been a real faithful child, then the tutor brought message to the father, "Oh, your son..."

91 Oh, now, that's the message I want Him to bring for you and I. "Oh, Your son, his whole thoughts is upon You. All he is trying to do is to please You. He is so

interested in Your affair, till it's hard to hold him down."

92 I'd rather be just a little over-zealous about the Father's Kingdom than to have no zeal at all, for It. I'd rather over-work. And as the church of Christ preacher told me, some time ago, "Mr. Branham, I'd rather—I'd rather wear out than rust out." And that is a lot of truth. I'd rather wear out, "and die in the harness," as Brother Neville said, than to refuse to have the harness on. You can't do nothing any worst than to neglect to try. Let us do all we can with what you have to do with. And the Holy Spirit, our Tutor, will bring it to the Father.

And, oh, how sweet it would be to hear the radio pick up the vibrations that's still in the earth from that word, "Come unto Me all ye

57 Abraham was promised a child, but he must maintain this promise for twenty-five years, the ups-and-downs that he had, and temptations, in those twenty-five years. But he held to the word of the promise.

And Israel was 58 promised a promised land, but they had to fight for every inch of it. "Wherever the soles of your foot treads upon, that have I given you," God said to Joshua. It was all there. The land was there, and God gave it to them, but they must fight for it.

59 The same way it is about Divine healing. God has got the power to heal you, if you've got the courage to

accept it, but you'll fight every inch of the way.

- 60 God has got amazing grace to save you, and He will do it, but you'll fight every inch of your way.
- 61 I been behind the pulpit, going on thirty-one years, and every inch of that has been a fight, constantly. It certainly has.
- 62 "But we must fight if we must reign." So we find out that the Bride has to make

Herself ready. "Be willing to lay aside every weight that does so easily beset us, that we might run with patience the race that's set before us." We must lay them aside, ourself. We can't say, "God, You come, lay them aside for us." We got to do that, ourselves.

63 Now, I like to think of weddings. I've had the privilege of marrying quite a few people. And I think, when I bring a young man and a young woman down to the

altar, and see them come down through the church; and she, pretty with her wedding garments on, and the veil over her face and hanging down; and the bridegroom, straight, dressed beautiful; and young and full of vigor, as they walk down there in their very best of life, and take that marriage vow, I think there is something sweet about it. There something sacred, because that it reminds me that there will be another great wedding

someday, when Christ's Bride will come walking down the corridors of Glory.

64 The Bridegroom will have everything ready. There'll be a wedding and a supper. How we love to think of setting across the table from each other, and shaking one another's hands, and tears running down our cheeks. And think, He will come around, wipe all tears from our eyes, say, "Don't cry. It's all over now. Enter into the

joys of the Lord that's been prepared for you since the foundation of the world." Oh, brother, that will make us love one another more.
