And I have absolutely told the manager in every meeting (Brother Jack Moore, setting here, was one of my first men in the field; he knows that I never would stand still for no begging for money: "Who'll give this? And who'll give that?"), "Pass the collection plate, and forget about it." God, it's when Hewhen He quits furni-...when He quits supplying my needs out here, it's time for me to leave the field then. So, I don't believe in this begging, and pulling, and persuading, and threatening, and—and everything else for money. No, sir.

When I first come into the ministry, I found out, through history, there is three things that's hurts a man, a servant of Christ. And when he...God will bless him and give him just a little ministry, then the first thing you know, one of the downfalls is *money*.

Next is popularity: When he gets to thinking he's somebody, right then he's on his road out. See. We're...there's no big shots among us, we're all the same, we're God's children (See?); there's none of us big, and none of us little, we're all God's children.

Then (money, popularity), and *women*: And I'm noted as

a woman-hater so, you know, you, that's way away, so that—that's out of the picture. I got one woman, is all the woman in the world, and that's my wife, sweetest woman that God ever put on earth, for me. That's right. She's mine, and mine alone; and I'm hers, and hers alone. And that: when I was a young man I thought that; now I'm an old man and I still think it.

at a famous denomination two or three of them together (that's the regular regular churches, like our modern churches here in the city, and so forth) at a big convention and they took the whole afternoon, standing on the platform—and threatening that that God would destroy their crops, would give their children polio, and things like that, if they didn't put into that meeting. That's exactly the truth, with this Bible before me. I said, "It's blasphemy to

God and to His followers." If God sends you, He'll take care of you. If He hasn't sent you, then let the denomination take care of you then. But but you...If God sends you, He'll take care of you.

Cancer went through her, and a doctor was converted on the case, Dr. Theodore Palouveas, which is preaching the Gospel this afternoon in Oakland, California. And how the Lord spoke to the woman, told her on three days she'd be shopping in the street. Told

her daughter she was unconscious. The doctor said, "The very idea, Reverend Branham, you build somebody up on a false hope like that, and that woman laying there dying."

11 I said, "I'm in position to stay here. If that woman isn't walking of the street well in three days, I'll put a sign on my back as false prophet, and you just run me around over town in front of your car. And then if she isn't, I'll do that. And if she is, let me put one on your back and go."

The doctor was converted, preaching the Gospel today. One of the best surgeons on the West Coast, people even flew from New York to be operated by him. And they sent me a-a million, five hundred thousands in a bank draft; two agents brought it, me living in a two room shanty at the time. But it isn't money what makes happiness, it...

Happiness doesn't consist of how much of the world's goods you own, but how contented you are with the portion that has been lotted to you. Just make yourself contented as long as one thing that brings contentment, and that alone, is Jesus Christ.

12 Here sometime ago, Mr. Avak, over in the same country, was given a great, big, nice Cadillac. I appreciate that. Any man that can ride in one, I appreciate it. And at that time, I had an old Chevrolet, old truck, all beat up, about eight, ten years old. And some of those wealthy, fine Armenian people said, "Brother Branham, we gave Avak a Cadillac. We got one for you."

And I said, "Thank you, but I don't believe I could use it."

Said, "Well, we'll give it to you. We'll give you a Packard, or whatever you want." Said, "That old truck, you beating around in it..."

I said, "If I got what I deserved, I'd walk." And that's true. But how could I come down through Arkansas, where some of my meetings are held among the poorest of people, a little old mother out there pulling a cotton sack, half dead with female trouble or something, eating jowl bacon, and corn bread for breakfast, putting a dollar in the offering at night, and me

come along down through there in a big, nice Cadillac... goes Brother "There Branham." I-I-I couldn't do that. No, no, I—I—I don't... I'd rather have favor with God than to have anything that I know of in the world. And if I got favor with God, I can serve His people.



2. And the Syrians had gone out by companies, and had brought away captive out of the land of Israel a little maid; and she waited on Naaman's wife.



People send and give me nice ties, shirts, socks. I was a little afraid to say anything about it from the platform. Maybe somebody thought that

I was... get the wrong impression, that I was just saying it just because maybe... Oh, no. Just don't think that. But it—it's so appreciated. I just couldn't let the people do things like that, and then let me not mention it ~ 52 ~

in some way. You know, some of don't even put their address on it.

I couldn't say the woman's name that bought me that suit of clothes. I—I couldn't never let her—let the—the right hand... left hand know what the right hand was doing, I suppose. But I—I appreciate it from the depths of my heart.

7 And I'll say this, my dear sister, and to all you others. You never give anything to anyone in your life that appreciated it any more than I do. That's right. I do.

And the Bible says, "Insomuch as you have done unto the least (That's me.) of My little ones, you have done it unto Me." He who receives a righteous man in the name of a righteous man receives a righteous man's reward. Whosoever receives а prophet in the name of the prophet, receives a prophet's reward.

said, "It's more blessed to give than it is to receive."

Then he told me of his story. I did... I just believe I'll tell this right now. It just comes to my mind for a moment. John B. Sharrit from Phoenix, Arizona, one of the business managers of the campaign...

Many of you has met him, no doubt. If anybody here would happen to know Brother Sharrit, or anybody, John Sharrit, Phoenix, Arizona? Well, he's a product of God's Bible School in Cincinnati, Ohio.

The dean of the college was just talking to me long distance a few moments ago, a very fine man, Brother Stanley. Many of you hear Brother Stanley from the... God's revivalist. He's at my house waiting for me now.

9 And he and Brother Raymond T. Richey... Many of you heard of him, haven't you, from Houston, Texas. He belongs to the church, Assemblies of God, and has a Evangelistic Temple there.

And so Brother Sharrit, he was borned kind of-of a fellow that didn't have very much of the world's goods. His father was a very poor man, and he was very rowdy. And he left his mother. And John Sharrit, about fifteen years ago, was selling apples at a nickel apiece out in front of him like this in St. Louis, Missouri. Apples... On a little

bi... couldn't have a cart to take care of his mother.

And he had an impediment of speech. He couldn't talk at all. If you go to talking, just stand at just ...?... He just ... he try again. And like if he was going to say, "Good evening, he'd say, "Goo... Brother Branham makes unintelligible noises—Ed.]" Wait a while and say, "Goo..." And that's about the way he'd try to get it; awful bad...?...

10 Well, but he begin to seek the Lord when he was a boy. And all the boys was running out to different places with young ladies. He said, "Lord, I-I'm going to trust You. I-I-I'd-I'd be awful out trying to talk to the young ladies. But I want to be married and have children. And I'm going to serve You, and You give me a wife." And he committed it to the Lord: age of about twenty-five.

If he could've passed every woman by in the world, he couldn't have a better one than what he's got. God give him a lovely little Spaniard.

But one great thing he loved children so well... She was barren. He was married for many, many years, six, seven, eight, ten years, no children.

He cut concrete on the street, twenty-five cents a hour to make a living. And they'd saved their money, and they bought a little three room house. I think it cost about fifteen hundred dollars back in the time of the depression. And they'd paid, and paid, and paid. And strived and paid until till they paid all of it off.

11 But just about the time they got it all paid off, they had a revival in Phoenix. And there was a man by the name of Doctor Sutton. Don't know whether you know him or not, he was by birth a Canadian. A Gospel—full Gospel preacher came down there to Phoenix, and he was staying in a tourist camp.

And the Lord appeared to Brother Sharrit one night in a dream. He said to him, "Take your silverware and your clothes and your wife, and leave your home, and turn that over to this Brother Sutton."

Think of it. After about ten years of hard labor in the depression, saving and striving, and the Lord told him Brother Sharrit said, "All right, Lord."

Went to his little companion, said, "Honey, the Lord has spoke to me and told me to turn our house over... Just to take our silverware and our clothes, and turn the house over to Doctor Sutton."

When he went and told her, she said, "All right, dear." She believed in her husband, said, "If the Lord said for you to do that, God's got something else for us to do."

12 So she... He turned all he had now. And he didn't have no place to take his wife that night. And they found the tourist camp that cost seventy-five cents. And they stayed in the tourist camp that night, and making twenty-five cents a hour cutting concrete on the street (That's right.), working daily for... He's a great big man, weighs about

two hundred and twenty-five pounds.

And about a week later, some rich lady told him thatthat she would move some of her things back in her garage, if he wanted to live in her garage, up towards Camelback Mountain (You know where this place is.), kind of a big old aristocratical part of the country there. Said, "You... If you'll keep my yard trimmed of a evening, when you come in, and keep the

grass watered, and so forth." Said, "You can live in my garage free."

He moved up there without one thing. He got some boxes, got him a springs and laid on the floor, got him a mattress, put on, him and his wife slept there.

Brother Sutton said, "Brother Sharrit, I don't..."

He said, "The Lord had said for me to do that. That's all right."

13 And he went on. And he was that way about a year, lived a good Christian life. And finally, the lady that he lived with was a multimillionaire woman. And she seen his honesty. He was a Christian just like a Daniel down in Babylon.

She went up to him one day. She said, "John," she said, "you know what? The Lord spoke to me last night in a dream, and told me that I shall loan you ten thousand dollars to go in business."

"Why," he said, (he couldn't talk) Said, "Lady, I—I can't even talk. I'll never make a businessman."

She said, "But the Lord told me to do it, and here's the check."

He said, "Well, ah, I—I—I can't take it." See? Said, "I—I don't want ten thousand dollars laying on my... No, huh-uh."

So she said, "But the Lord said for me to give it to you. I notice you've been a good honest man, seen you reading the Bible. And I got me a Bible and was reading. And the Lord told me to give you the check, loan it to you, for ten thousand dollars to go in business."

Today John Sharrit's worth a half a million dollars. That's been about six or seven years ago since he started, worth a half a million dollars. He's the father of three fine little children. Oh, my.



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### Message: 55-0301 - Elijah

8 Now, over in Second Kings, tonight, last night speaking on Elijah, the prophet. And tonight, we had him last night going up to when Elijah, rather, and Jehoshaphat, and them, come down to meet him. Tonight, we got him in another scene in the 4th chapter of-of Second Kings. And just for a text, I want to read the 24th

verse of the 4th chapter of Second Kings.

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And she...Then she saddled an ass, and said unto her servant, Drive, and go forward; slack not thy riding for me, except I bid thee.

May the Lord add His blessings to the reading of this verse of Scripture.

9 Now, our scene begins tonight upon a family in distress. And perhaps, this would be a good thing tonight to recognize that there's, perhaps, many families setting here tonight in distress.

And if we can only find something in the Old Testament here, which was an example of what believers done in that day when in distress, why, perhaps, maybe we can take them as an example and find our position then and what to do.

In the days of Elijah the prophet...After last night we seen that he was a type of the church. After Elijah, being the type of Christ taken away, and the double coming up on the prophet...We find that he made his way up to a Gentile country, Shunem. And there was a noble woman up there. And she was not an Israelite; she was a Shunammite.

And Elijah passing through this country, she taken notice to him that he was a holy man, a man of God. What a lesson we could get out of that, that we—our walk and our associations with people, that people would recognize that we were children of the King. God help us to be that way.

I believe the Scripture says that, "We are written epistles read of all men." And Elisha so conducted hisself around in that Gentile country there, that this Shunammite woman realized that he was truly a servant of God. His character, his conduct, and the things that God did by him, that she recognized him to be a

servant of the Lord. So she wanted to show some kindness to him. So she had him come over for dinner, or what-more, give him a little offering, help him pay for something. Treated him kind, not because she wanted any reward.

10 People who give to people thinking that they'd get a reward for it, well, they don't have any reward. It's those who give freely from the bottom of their heart, that ~ 87 ~

says, "I just give it freely, not that I expect anything in return."

Jesus said that, "The Gentiles, or unbelievers do such as that. They give when they're expect to be given back." But we, the children of God, give when we don't want any return. We just give it.

And now, the woman had no...She proved it a little later. She had no alternative of giving to this man, the—the blessings that she was to him

of giving him. Food, money, whatever she give him, had a little offering for him when he passed by, she only give it in respects of God. She said, "I know that he's a holy man. I know that he's a man of God. And I... He don't belong to my denomination. He doesn't belong to my church, perhaps, but maybe my pastor wouldn't agree with him; but yet, I believe that he's a holy man of God. I believe he's God's servant. So I'll just give

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him this little offering." So she did that in her kindness.

11 After while she begin to realize that there was something real good about the man. So she said to her husband, she said, "You know this man that passes by here is a-a man of God. He's God's servant. And now, we're worth a little money. We've been giving just a little bit as he pass by. Let's show him some kindness. Let's build just a little room out here

somewhere. When he passes by, he looks so tired and weary, when he's on his road up the mountain to pray and fast; for days at a time he goes up there. And let's just make a little place out here that's on our...We got plenty of ground, so let's build him a little room out here, and put a little table in it, and a candle, and a little stool; that when he passes by, why, he can come in and refresh hisself, and lay down on the bed, and rest a little while." That's—that's

thinking a whole lot of someone.

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So they...She fixed him this place. And the husband, being a, perhaps, a just and good man, he said, "Well, that would just be fine."

So they go and build a little place and just give it to the prophet as he passes by.

And it came to pass, one day, when Elisha was coming that way, that he—he stopped by. And he found this little place. Of course, he was very happy to find that the people loved him.

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Now, everybody wants to be loved. I tell you the truth. I do. I want God to love me, and I want the people to love me. That's exactly the truth. And if God loves me, then the people will love me. And if I love His people, then He will love me for doing it. God would rather I'd love you, than love Him. Did you know that? I'd rather you love my boy back there, no matter what

you say about me. I want you to love my children. And any father would think that. So Father God thinks the same thing for He said, "Insomuch as you have done unto the least of these, My little ones, you have did it unto Me." So if you want to love God, just start loving all of His children. And God will reward you. If you'll just love His children that shows the love of God is in you.

12 Jesus said, "This is the way that all the people to know that you're-you're children of God and passed from death unto Life, when you have love one for another." Then you'll know it. Not because you can have a big church, that's all right. Not because that you have a lot of fine ministers come by, that-that's good, too. But it's because that you have love one for another.

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Now, when this revival's over and you all go to your respective churches...We're not here to proselyte, and tell you, "All leave one church and go to another." You keep your church. Try to bring some sinners into that church.

Then when you go back to your respective church, go back with such a heart full of love. And that—that woman that you just couldn't stand or that man, love him or her anyhow. They'll know you got

something out of the meeting then. That's right. If you don't do that, then you-you-you haven't gained anything yet. 'Cause you've got to have love one for another. Then the people...The-the outside world will know that you've passed from death unto Life when you have love one for another.

Jesus said, "You're the salt of the earth. But if the salt's lost it's savour (That's its strength.), it is henceforth good for nothing, but to be cast out and trod under the foot of man." About here last year, I was holding your convention for the Foursquare people in California, and I passed the Salt Lake Deserts and that's what I seen then, the salt left its savour, nothing but just to make walks

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out of.

13 But salt is a savour if it contacts. You—you have a piece of meat here, and a barrel of salt here, you've got



to get them together to, the salt to the meat or the meat to the salt, to preserve the meat. And that's the way it is. We've got to get the believer with the unbeliever. That's right. You've got to get them into the Church, into the salty bunch of people. And you know, salt-salt also makes a thirst, doesn't it? And if you eat salt, you get thirsty. And God wants His Church so salty, till the whole world will thirst to be like them (That's right. See?), just thirsty, just

thirsty. Just think, say, "Oh, if I could only live the way that woman lived. If she ain't the most sweetest, peaceful person, never out of humor, never is fussy. She's always kind, trying to do something to help somebody else. Why, she's a credit to any man's church."

Yes, sir, that man used...He's a neighbor; he's a gentleman; he's just so full of the love of God. You can see him at all hours of night on his ~ 100 ~

knees somewhere praying. He's always ready to go do something; he's always talking about the Lord Jesus and His mercy. That's the way to make the world salty. Act like that.

Now, Elijah was that type of person. So then, one day, coming by, being tired and weary in his journey, I can see him say, "Well, looky here," a little sign hanging on the door, "This property belongs to the man of God that passes this

way." I can hear him say to his servant, "Why, Gehazi, looky here, this Shunammite people here has give us this little piece of property, here, that we can—we can drop in." He opens the door, for it's his, goes in, lays down upon the bed, stretches hisself out. Said, "You know she's been awful kind to us, Gehazi. She's just ministered to us in everything that we have need of. Go in and talk to her." Look like he ought to have went in. But he said,

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"You go in and talk to her and see if she wants me to speak to the king or to the chief captain. They all like me. I'm good friends. Maybe she'd want a favor or something like that." I believe that Elijah was only trying her.

14 So he—he went, and asked her and she said, "No, I dwell among my people, and I didn't want any reward for this, in otherwise. I just did it because that, I, myself, love the Lord, and I want to do something for Him, so the only way I could do it, I seen him to be a real servant of God, and a man of God, so I just done this for that purpose. I don't want any reward."

And so he goes back, and Elisha, said, talked about it a little while. And I imagine Gehazi said, "Elisha, I'll tell you one thing," said, "she hasn't got any children, and her husband's old."

"Yes." Elisha said. I imagine he turned over on this

little bed that he had in there, and laid there a few minutes, and thought. After while a vision come before him, and he seen the woman bear a child, said, "Go get her and bring her out here."

So he went and got the woman and brought her out to the door, and when she walked to the door, he said, "THUS SAITH THE LORD, according to time of life, about this time next year you're going to embrace a son." ~ 105 ~

15 She said, "Nay, now," said, "I-I my husband's old," but just the same Elijah said that, "it was in the Name of the Lord," so that settled it. When God says anything, that completes it right then. That's all. No need of wondering any more, God has said so.

If God said that Christ was returning to the earth, I believe it. That's right. If God said these kinds of times have come, and men would be ~ 106 ~

heavy highminded, lovers of pleasure more than God, I believe it. That's right. Everything that God says, I believe it.

He said, "He was wounded from our transgressions." I believe it. He said, "By His strips, we were healed," I believe it. So that settles it. See? If you believe it, then take it, act on it, and that's...The results will come.

No matter how long it tarries, just keep believing

it. Abraham // tarried, or Abraham waited for twentyfive years before the promise ever come. But he was getting stronger all the time, praising God: Baby was going to be born anyhow, made arrangements for it, everything, got ready for the event. Just as soon as God told him it was going to happen, he made everything ready. And then, waiting twenty-five years, just kept waiting until finally it happened, growing stronger

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all the time. When God speaks, it's got to come to pass.



64 And this woman, perhaps, maybe, let's say she, one day, she went up in the street and she heard someone preaching on the street corner. And she seen him rejected, and she knew that was a servant of God. So I can imagine after Elisha got through preaching, she said, "Kind, sir, would you go and meet my husband? I will

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fix you all some lunch, right away."

65 Well, I can hear Elisha say, "Thank you, ma'am. I'll be glad to do that for I'm a bit hungry after the message." And down to the house they went. She goes in and introduces her husband to this prophet and Gehazi, the servant. And she made some cakes ready right quick, and some little dainties, some little cookies, and so forth.

66 And by the way, there's a little Danish woman last

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evening that sent me a box of cookies and some things to take...I know she's not...She can't understand English, anyhow, if she's here. Probably don't want to know what, the right hand know what the left hand's doing. And I thank you, each one, for your little tokens and blessings. I appreciate them. And this little Danish woman sent me some cookies to take home to the babies. And said they were Danish, and she couldn't write English, so had someone else to write it.

Now, I'm having the awfulest time to keep out of them before I take them to the kids. I'm just having an awful time. I walk back and forth, and look at them, and back to the other side and look at them. But I'm trying to make it out till I go
