65 In Noah's time, type of today: Jesus referred to it, and said, "As it was in Noah's time, so shall it be in the Coming of the Son of man. In Noah's time, so shall it be in the Coming of the Son of man." Notice, there were all that antediluvian world, perhaps of millions of people, there was eight

overcomers. Eight people overcome, that was real, genuine overcomers. There was Noah's three sons and their wives, and Noah and his wife. Eight overcome, that entered the ark at the appropriate time. How did they do it? They listened to the Word of God. They wasn't caught outside the door. They were caught inside the door.

66 Oh, my beloved friends, don't let that door shut. Jesus said, "As it was in that day, so shall it be in the Coming of the Son of man." (Thank you, brother.) "So shall it be in the Coming of the Son of man." Now, there's somebody is going to get caught outside that door.

Many of them might have had good intentions, and, "Some day, if such things happen, we'll go in with Brother Noah, 'cause he's a fine fellow." But, you see, it caught just eight inside. 67 Now, think hard now. If you are laying around, getting doty, get in. Hurry, quick, 'cause the door might close at any time.

68 And there's always been an ark in God's economy. There was an ark in the days of Noah, for the saving of His people. There was an ark in the days of the law, ark of testimony. In the days of the law, they followed the ark.

And there is a third dispensation now; like Noah's

time, Lot's time, and now this time. There is an ark now. And that ark is not a denomination, neither is it a good works that you do. It's "by one Spirit," Romans 8:1, "we are all baptized into one Body, in the domain of that Kingdom, one Spiritual baptism."

No matter how good, how bad, whatever, you're in that Kingdom by—by Holy Ghost baptism. See? That's the only way you overcome. It's all that is under the shed Blood is overcomers, 'cause you cannot overcome, yourself. It's He that overcome for you. You're resting.

69 "How will I know then, Brother Branham, that I'm in There?"

Watch what kind of a life you're living.

Just look around. See if it's just lived out of you,

automatically. Or, do you have to strain and pull, see, then you're doing it.

But don't try to do it. Did you ever try? Yeah. Don't.

70 Just like putting a little baby's arm in a sleeve hole, you see.

He's just up, down, over, and everything else. See?

He can't do it.

"Put on your coat, honey." He can't do it. Little arm is up, down, around. It takes your steady hand.

Oh, how glad I am, I can just yield my hand to Father, say, "Lord Jesus, I can't get in There. You help me. Put the coat on me."

I quit trying. Just let Him do it. See?

71 If the little baby keeps trying, "Oh, I can do it. I can do it."

And he's just everywhere. He can't do it.

Neither can you, neither can I, but if we'll just hold still and let Him do it.

Just yield to Him, "Here, Lord, here I am. Just—just let me be nothing. I—I yield. You put my hand in the right place." That's the victory. That's overcoming.

72 The thing you have to overcome is yourself, your idea,

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your thing, and surrender yourself to Him. He overcome for you. He knows the way; we don't.

73 But in Noah's time there was eight overcomers, and that's what went in. They were caught inside.

Now look, friends. I believe they're taping this. And if it's on television, or not tel-...pardon me, a tape. Whatever you do, who is listening now, or who will listen hereafter, the hour is very late, and you do have good intention, but be caught inside.

Now, don't struggle.

"Not him that willeth, or him that runneth, but God."

Just let God.

Just yield yourself to Him and walk on, with a perfect, satisfied faith, that, "What God has promised He is able to perform." Not joining one denomination, another denomination, running this, that, or the other, trying this.

Just yield yourself to God, and walk with Him, peaceful, quiet, not interrupted. Just keep on walking with Him. That's right.

74 That's what I told our brother that just had the—the breakdown. See? "Just yield to Him. He's here, He Who knowed what you have done, and what caused your being and doing this way, and all that. He knows all about you, and now He's just told you back just what to do. Now," I said, "only thing you have to do is just go do it. That is, forget all about the past, walk, live for the future, in the Glory and Presence of God."

134 And stand here and see this Eternal Word that's waved every storm! When they tried to burn the Bibles and everything, It waved right on just the same, because It said, "Heavens and earth shall pass away, but My Word shall not pass away."

135 Up here near Chicago now, and a—a Bible lays on a pulpit of a church. Way back before the First World War, a missionary had it and a fellow was converted, and he wanted to give the missionary his Bible, said, "I can't give you this one, my mother had give me this one." Said, "I, when I get home, I'll send you one."

136 He started back across the sea and a German submarine blowed the—the ship up. They

never found a piece of it. And two years later, way down on the coast, they seen a box floating. Some of them thought it might be something that drowned, and so they got the box out and opened it up, two fellows walking along. And in there, the only thing that survived it, there was that Bible he was sending back to the missionary. It lays on a pulpit here near Chicago today, in a Methodist church. "Heavens and earth shall

pass away, but My Word shall not pass away."

137 During the time of the flood here, in 1937, this little ol' church, when the mud floors and so forth that was in it, we could ride over the top of it here in a-in a rowboat. The floods went up. And, well, that night when I had preached the Gospel and had left my Bible laying open on the pulpit when I had went home; predicting that flood would come, I said, "I seen him measure twenty-two feet over Spring Street down here."

138 Old Brother Jim Wiseheart and them laughed at me. You remember that, Brother George? I said... He—he said, "Oh, Billy, in '84 it only was about six inches on Spring Street."

139 I said, "I seen a man come down from the skies, and take a measure stick and stick it there on Spring Street, said twenty-two feet." He said, "You're just excited."

I said, "I'm not excited! It's THUS SAITH THE LORD!"

140 Ask them how many feet was over Spring Street. Twentytwo feet to the—the inch! Exactly.

141 And that old Bible where it had been preached on that night... She started raining, the floods breaking through and so forth, and this old church... The seats went right straight up to the ceiling, the

Bible went right straight up to the ceiling, washing through here with all that water raising it up. The pulpit went right straight up. They come right down; and every seat set right back in the same place, and the Bible laid right back in the same place, and all that water, and still opened up, the same chapter at the same place.

142 "Heavens and earth will pass away, but My Word shall never pass away." ~ 9 ~

143 How that Bible float in that salty water for two years without even soiling the words on It! God's Words are true. Amen.

144 I remember after that, old Brother Jim Wiseheart was so satisfied with that, every time he'd get a pain on his arm... He got some kind of wrong with him when he got about seventy-five years old, he got rheumatism. The pain would go to hurting here, he'd run get the Bible, and open it up,

lay it on there, another pain down here. I come up there one day and he had so many Bibles over him I couldn't see Brother Jim, he just had Bibles all over him! He said, "It's God's promise!" That's it.

99 Paul was correctly a prisoner. He wasn't making any wrong statement. He was trained by the Holy Ghost, again, to wait on the Word. Now, he had been trained one way, but—but God had trained him another way now. He was trained by the Holy Spirit to wait upon the Lord, no matter what his ambitions was.

100 Now I'm going to, help by the Holy Spirit, show you something. See? Now let's just take an instance.

101 One day, Paul and Silas, coming down the street in a certain city where they was holding a revival. And a little, demon-possessed girl kept following him, crying out after him. And no doubt but what Paul knowed that he had the authority, as an apostle, to rebuke that evil spirit out of that woman. But did

102 Then he said, "Thou spirit, come out of her." See? He knowed to wait on the Lord.

103 And there is where so many people today bring a reproach upon the Word. They go out with an ambition. How many revivals has been left flat because of a thing like that, because the

evangelist don't wait to see what the Lord has got to say! Some of them say, "Come over here," and they-they go right now because the—the association said, "Go." And the Holy Spirit would say something different. Yet, the ambition of the man to become the state presbyter, or—or something another, or some elder, or some bishop, or something would-would pull him, "You must go." And, yet, he knows better. The Holy Spirit saying, "Go here."

See? He's yoked to his organization. He's a prisoner to the organization.

104 But if he's yoked to Christ, he's led by the Holy Ghost. He ...?... See? He, he's yoked, a prisoner. Don't make any difference what anything else says; it's-it's a-it's a—a sounding brass and a tinkling cymbal. He hears only the Voice of God, and he speaks only when It comes out. He says nothing.

105 Somebody say, "Oh, oh, Brother Jones!" Or, there, Brother Roberts, or some, these great men in our land today, like Tommy Hicks, or-or-or Oral Roberts, oror Brother Tommy Osborn, some of those great evangelists. If somebody would say, "Say, come over here, Tommy. You're a great man of God." (Or Oral.) "And I-I got a-a uncle that's laying over here, that's-that's all bound. And he's-he's sick. I want you come

over. I believe you have the strength to heal him." See?

And maybe the Holy Spirit would say to him, "Not now."

106 But, yet, to the friendship of that man, he's duty bound to go with him. If he don't, he becomes an enemy to that man. That man say, "Well, he went to so-and-so, heal that child or that boy. I know he did. And I been his friend, for years, see, and he wouldn't come to my place."

107 But if he's constrained by the Holy Spirit not to go, he better not go, if he's yoked to God. His friend, he love. But he better be led of the Holy Spirit to go there, because it won't do any good, anyhow. I experience that so many time.

108 But Paul just waited for the Spirit to tell him what to do. "Wait on the Spirit," said.

And of Daniel and the lions we often sing.


Oh, but there's many, many others in the Bible,
